- ✓ Wolverine assembly and cultural performance
- ✓ Earth Ambassadors – 2 students from each class
- ✓ Increased our days for Alien In-line skating so that all students can have 2 sessions (new price is \$5,442.57 – PAC had previously agreed to \$2600 already)
- ✓ The first Equity in Action Agreement for Truth and Reconciliation (2020-2025) Signing Ceremony, which was held five years ago in partnership with Westbank First Nation, Okanagan Indian Band, Okanagan Nation Alliance, Ki-Low-Na Friendship Society, Lake Country Native Association, and Kelowna Métis Association, as well as the Central Okanagan Board of Education and Ministry of Education.
