PRESIDENT'S REPORT



What a year! I want to start by thanking our team of hardworking executives for all their efforts throughout the year – your time spent brainstorming, organizing, and executing Chief Tomat Elementary Parent Advisory Council's various initiatives is greatly appreciated! When looking back on the 2024/2025 school year it's clear, we were busy! With our continued focus on building community at CTE, we eased up on our fundraisers and focused on community events and givebacks.

Over the course of the year, CTE PAC supported our school and its community in the following ways:

- Monthly hot dog days.
- Providing school compost services through Spa Hills.
- Fall Market featuring several talented vendors.
- Our annual Monster Mash dance with a DJ, photo booth, and costume prizes. Halloween chip treat for all students during the school's costume parade.
- Winter tree ornaments for all students to decorate and hang on the school's holiday trees. Christmas movie snack for all students.
- School-wide food drive competition with the winning class awarded celebratory cupcakes. Winter hot chocolate day in support of literacy week.
- Wolverine t-shirts for all new Chief Tomat students, as well as new shirts for existing students if needed (cost-share from prior year that carried forward to current).
- Financial support for Alien Inline Skating (cost shared 50/50 with school administration). Financial support for Wheelchair Basketball (cost shared 50/50 with school administration). Two post-secondary education bursaries available to former CTE students (one bursary carried forward from the prior year).
- Teacher appreciation throughout the year (i.e. staff room and holiday treats) More than \$4,500 toward new classroom and library books, music gear, and classroom resources!
- Rewriting our Constitution and Bylaws to better guide and support our PAC and school's families.
- Financial support toward our library's upcoming year-end BBQ.
- Our upcoming freezie day to celebrate the end of school.
- PAC's upcoming year-end carnival, complete with food, drinks, carnival games, zorbs, jousting, and bouncy houses!



- Various fundraisers through the year such as an Ice Cream Day at Paynter's Market, Mabel's Labels, bottle collections, Fall Photo session, Purdy's Chocolates, Holiday Wish & Win, and VIP Seat raffle.
- Unfortunately, our annual back to school BBQ had to be put on hold this year due to construction at the school, but we hope to see it return this fall to celebrate not only a return to school but also the amazing school expansion currently underway at CTE.

While the events and fundraisers kept us busy, seeing student relationships form and the community spirit grow with the support of our initiatives was rewarding and made the time and effort we dedicated to these events worthwhile. Thank you to the CTE administration and staff for supporting us through the year, and for all the hard work of our executives and wonderful volunteers!
